Biography

Born in Lincolnshire in 1992, the pianist Cameron Richardson-Eames is a graduate of Trinity College Cambridge, the Royal Academy of Music in London, and a former US-UK Fulbright Scholar at The Juilliard School in New York where he held the Irene Diamond Fellowship, the Samuel Sanders Award for collaborative piano, and the Arthur Gold, Robert Fizedale, and George H Gangwere Scholarships. At Cambridge he was a Choral Scholar and graduated with high First Class Honours, a Senior Academic Scholarship, Newton Scholarship, Research Scholarship, as well as the Inaugural postgraduate scholarship for voice. Receiving the highest dissertation mark in his year, he was immediately appointed to the academic music faculty of Cambridge University, where he spent three years teaching Dissertation Studies and Keyboard Harmony. At the Royal Academy of Music, he was awarded the Major Von Someron Godfrey Award for accompanists, Dame Ruth Railton Prize for chamber music, Katie Thomas Memorial Award for outstanding achievement, and the honorary Diploma of the Royal Academy of Music for outstanding postgraduate performance.

Recent engagements include broadcasts on BBC Radio 3, Classic FM, Südwestrundfunk Deutschland and WQXR in the US, including giving a live BBC broadcast at the opening night of the BBC Proms, and performances in the UK at the Wigmore Hall, St John's Smith Square, St James's Piccadilly, as well as in Belgium, Denmark, Germany, France, Italy, Estonia, Malta, and in New York at Alice Tully Hall (Lincoln Center) and Carnegie Hall. Recent festival appearances include the *Festspiel Mecklenburg-Vorpommern* in Germany (with Eva Zavaró, violin), *Festival Bach en Combrailles* in France, *Jeunes Talents* (Paris), Ryedale Festival in the UK (with Matilda Lloyd, trumpet) and the Joye in Aiken festival (South Carolina). His many other collaborative partners include former BBC New Generation Artist Jennifer Johnston (mezzo-soprano), Tamara Banjesevic (soprano, *Opera Bastille*), and violinists Max Tan, Francisco Coser, and Johanna Röhrig. Last summer he was a member of the piano staff at Ravinia's Steans Music Institute in Chicago. As part of the Aldeburgh Festival, Cameron gave world premiers of newly discovered works by Benjamin Britten. He is a Britten-Pears Young Artist, and a former Park Lane Group Young Artist and Rudolphe Kempe International Young Concert Artist.

Cameron trained as a joint first-study singer and regularly performs with the Grammy-nominated groups Polyphony (Stephen Layton, voted second-best choir in the world by Gramophone magazine) and The Choir of Trinity College Cambridge, with whom he recorded fourteen CDs for the Hyperion record label. He appears as a tenor soloist on the Christmas album 'Yulefest' (Hyperion), about which the *Los Angeles Times* wrote 'if you're not touched by tenor Cameron Richardson-Eames, you have grinch in your soul'. He studied voice with Professor Susan McCulloch (Guildhall School of Music and Drama), and now works as a vocal coach in New York, with current students appearing in many Broadway shows (including *Matilda*, *Frozen*, *School of Rock*, *Kinky Boots*, *The Ferryman*), world tours (*Kinky Boots*, *Fun Home*), television series (*Billions*), commercials (JetBlue, RiteAid, Hilton Hotels) and feature films. His extremely varied career includes playing for the Brit Award-winning crossover band, BLAKE, whose most recent album reached number one in the UK Classical Charts and who recorded a Christmas album with Dame Shirley Bassey. Cameron is a Fellow of Trinity College London in piano performance, and was Head Boy. Caistor Grammar School in 2010-2011.
